Some of these animals and birds are very common, others quite shy.

With a wingspan of 24-30 inches and body size of 16-19 inches, the **Pileated Woodpecker** is the largest North American woodpecker. They tend to be shy, seen most often in late spring. A pair of Pileateds typically protect

American Mink The **American mink** is certainly known for its beautiful fur coat, but these intelligent creatures were originally known for their ability to take care of pesky rodents such as mice and rats. Equally comfortable in the water, on land, or scurrying across the ice in winter, mink can be seen fairly frequently around Three Coyotes are another shy member of the wildlife community...and most of us are happy about that! These intelligent and adaptable animals would actually prefer to stay away from humans and pose little danger...but we are seeing more of them around the lake as they adapt to us being there. They are about 35-40 pounds and their haunting howling can be heard in early evening.
